

Eligibility Criteria and Visit Schedule (SLVP website link)

This segment of the Vaccine Program website is designed to provide more detailed information to volunteers who are interested in participating in the study. There are three sections.

In the first section you will find a list of requirements you will need to meet in order to be considered for participation.

In the next section you will find events or conditions that might make you ineligible to participate.

In the last section you will find a table of study visits and procedures. This will give you a better idea of the study requirements and the time commitment involved.

Eligibility Requirements:

Section I. To be considered, you or your child should meet these requirements:

1. Male and female children and adults 6 months of age and older
2. Meet the criteria for influenza-like illness (ILI) as defined by the CDC: fever (temperature of 100°F or greater) AND a cough and/or sore throat in the absence of known cause other than influenza
3. Willing to complete the informed consent process
4. Available to complete an initial study visit with a brief follow-up phone call one week later. Completion of a second visit (approximately 28 days after visit 1) is encouraged, but optional.

Section II. To be considered, you or your child should ***not*** have any of these events or conditions that could put your or your child's health at risk if you/your child were to participate in the study.

1. Have chronic HIV, Hepatitis B or Hepatitis C infection
2. Have received a blood transfusion or any blood products such as platelets within the past 6 months
3. Currently pregnant
4. Any condition that would be important for the researchers to know about. We are asking to make sure it is safe for you to participate in the study.

Scheduling Appointments:

Section III. Study Visits/ Schedule

For all volunteers there will be 1 or 2 clinic visits and a brief phone contact. Your/your child first visit must occur at the time of your flu-like illness. It will require approximately 45 minutes of your time. We will ask you to keep a diary of your symptoms each day. There will be a brief phone call (10 min) about 7-10 days later to review your diary and schedule your/your child's last clinic visit. The second visit will take 20-25 minutes of your time. We encourage you to complete the second visit, but it is optional.

The visit schedule is as follows:
